Digitising administration from the ground up

In early 2019, Adelaide Botanic High School joined the EdSmart Smart Schools community. EdSmart's platform was selected as their key School Organisation System (SOS) based on its capacity for integration and customisation.

Considered Adelaide's newest and most remarkable high school, the \$100 million Adelaide Botanic High School opened at the start of 2019. The school is committed to showcasing the best of 21st century learning, catering for the needs of all students through its extensive curriculum rooted in science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM), as well as building local relationships and research.

Kirsty Gebert, Assistant Principal at Adelaide Botanic High School, says EdSmart appealed to Adelaide Botanic High School because its deployment has empowered the school to "communicate using a 100% digital format, and set this expectation for our families right from the start."
